

## **Home Learning**

The websites below give quick, easy lessons for children to follow. Many have video support. They are also organised into year groups and topics to make appropriate learning easy to find.

## General – covering all areas

https://classroom.thenational.academy/ - this is the website set up by the Government to support parents with home learning and provides resources for across the curriculum. There are units for EYFS and KS1. You could try to find a unit similar to what your child is currently learning about in school (see above) or pick something that may interest them.

https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/primary - this is the BBC website that covers KS1 and KS2 but much of the work in the Year 1 section could be easily simplified for EYFS (particularly the English content, as this also includes phonics). You can also find resources that match our work in topic (e.g. plants, maps etc).

https://www.hamilton-trust.org.uk/blog/learning-home-packs/ - the Hamilton Trust have produced home learning packs (including ones for Reception Classes). You can download and print them if you would like to. It's worth downloading the overview and looking at that before you choose a pack to make sure it is suitable for your child.

http://www.crickweb.co.uk/Early-Years.html - this is great for Year R children, giving a range of games and interactive activities that cover much of the work being done in class. They do work best on a PC or Mac.

## English (phonics, reading and writing)

## Maths

- Choose the year group that your child is in. These units will be broadly in line with what your child will be doing in school
- There are activities to do as part of the video. You can pause the video and complete these on paper.
- In addition, it is possible to buy a workbook or print a parent workbook from the 'primary resources' section, but these are not necessary.
